

Trend in Meat Shopping

More than 300 different cuts of meat adorn the counters of food stores across the nation. But this may change in the future. One possibility is that the wide variety of cuts might be reduced to a few basic boneless cuts, explains Catherine Love, Penn State extension consumer economics specialist. In beef, there might be steaks for broiling and pan-frying, oven and pot roasts, stewing meat, and hamburger. Shopping would be easier, and retailers wouldn't need to carry the extensive inventory they do today.

Medium sized eggs, milk and dairy products, frozen orange juice plus vegetable fats and oils are currently in plentiful supply and offering economy to the food shopper.

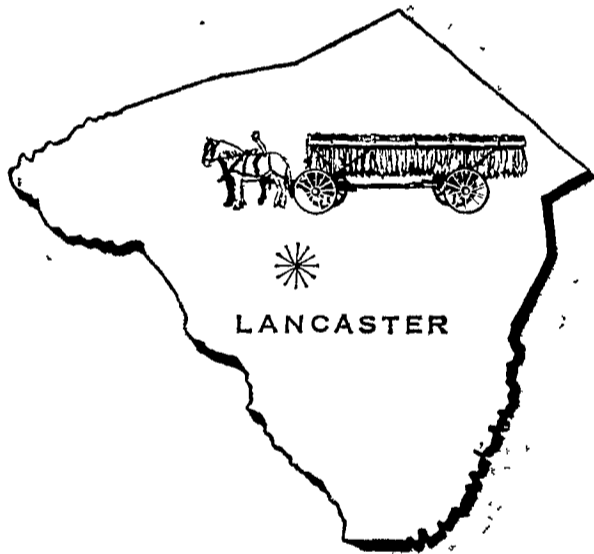
