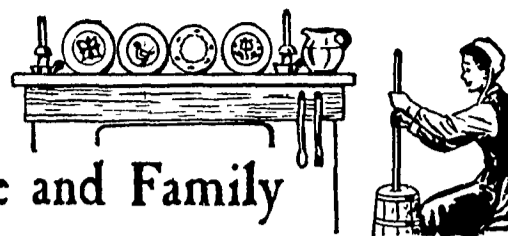

**About Sewing Machine Care**

Read the instruction book for specific information on sewing machine care. The book tells where to oil the machine, and also gives instructions about lubrication.

It's a good idea to keep a can of sewing machine oil handy for use after every eight hours of sewing. Put a drop of oil in every hole as the instruction book directs. But use only a drop since too much oil catches dust or spots the fabric as you sew. After oiling, stitch on a scrap of fabric to take up excess oil and to help the oil circulate.



THURSTON

To prevent lint from gathering on parts of the machine, keep it covered when not in use. Dust it regularly, too. A special place to check for lint is under the throat plate . . . and use a dry brush to remove lint that gathers there.

Never use oil on gears or rubber belts. If your machine requires lubrication do it every six months to keep it running smoothly. The place to lubricate is the gears.

A special room for sewing is the dream of many homemakers, but when there isn't a special room you can still do something about a sewing area.

In a dual-purpose room, allow a space five by ten feet for your sewing activities. You need a place for cutting, hand sewing, machine sewing, pressing, fitting, and storage. Try to locate the machine so you won't have to move it to use it.

Since you'll be pressing during the entire sewing process, you'll want the ironing board and iron in your sewing area.

It takes less time to get ready to sew when you can leave the ironing board in the sewing center. In the fitting area, put a full-length mirror and have a place to hang or lay garments. You can provide privacy with a screen.

Plan for storage of small items in a box or tray.

only wooden or non-metal spoons or spatulas. Never cut food while it is in the pan.

Avoid overheating when the pan is empty. And don't use steel wool or scouring powder on pads.

Cleaning is easy . . . simply wash out the pan with detergent and water, then rinse and dry. Should particles of food stick, remove them gently with a wooden spatula.

**SERVICE FROM KITCHEN KNIVES**

Store knives in special knife compartments so the blades don't become dulled by striking against each other or against other objects. Slotted holders, partitioned drawers, or magnetic holders are suggestions for storing knives.

Wash knives separately, not piled in the pan with silverware and utensils.

Avoid leaving knives in hot water, and you'll help to prevent cuts, rusting or dulling of the blades, and soaking of the handle.

Never use a sharp-edged knife as a pancake turner or subject it to the heat of a flame . . . heat destroys the temper of the steel.

A knife is not a substitute for a can or bottle opener or a screwdriver. Cutting string or paper and sharpening pencils are not jobs for a good knife.

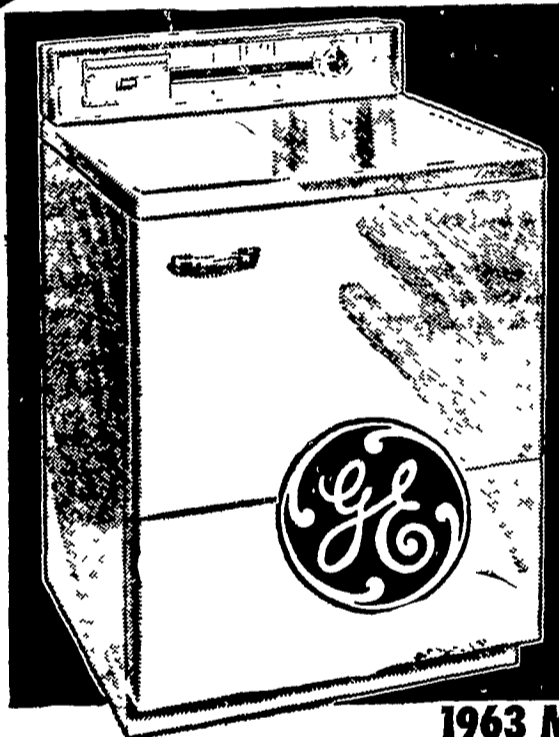
