 cord October 1.

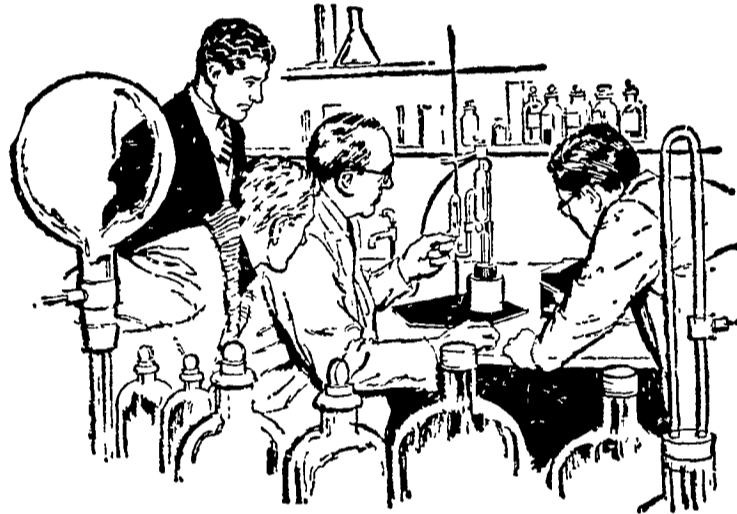
Jacob L. Hain, Chairman of
