HARRISBURG - Oak wilt. baffling fungus disease, was found and treated in 386 areas in 15 Pennsylvania counties during the past summer, Dr Thomas L. Guyton, director of the Bureau of Plant Industry, State Department of Agriculture, said today.

Of the 386 known cases, 60 were single intections, involving only one tiee, 274 group infections of more than one tree each, and 52 breakover attacks that developed over the boundary of pieviously treated areas

Trees that had died from the wilt totaled 956 and another \$67 were dying when the disease was located Tiees out as a control measure totaled 5.054

in 18 counties

A disease known only in the United States, oak wilt was first found in Wisconsin where its fungus origin was determined in 1944. Meanwhile, it has been found in 17 other states, most of them in the mid-western and south vania it was first found in central sections. In Pennsyl-1950 near McVeytown, Mifflin County. None has yet been located in Lancaster County.




