## Penn State Vet. Gets Study Grant

Dr. Samuel B. Guss, extension veterinarian on the staff of the Pennsylvania State University since December 1955 and well known to dairymen of Lancaster County has been given a grant of \$3,000 by the National Science Foundation for research.

Doctor Guss left Oct. 24 for New Zealand where he will spend eight weeks in a study of sheep management for internal parasite control, milking machine methods and mastitis control. He will work at Massey Agricultural College, Palmerston North and at the Animal Research Station, Ruakura.

From Jan. 7 until Feb. 22, 1963, he will be at the University of Sydney, Australia for similar study. He will continue research in Germany, Sweden, Denmark and England from April 1 until May 24, after short visits to Indonesia, Thailand, India, the Holy Land, Egypt, Greece, Turkey and Yugoslavia.

In his extension veterinary work, Doctor Guss has devoted most of his time to work in dairy and livestock health and related problems and has worked closely with the county and statewide dairy and livestock health committees. He has been particularly active in the campaign on brucellosis that resulted in certification of the State as free of that disease. Recently he has been active in the new " Crusade against Mastitis".

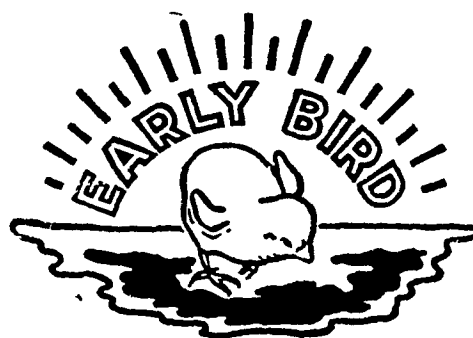

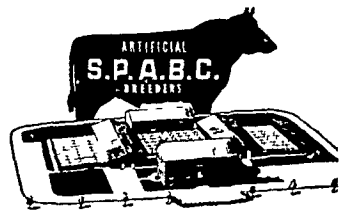
