

Prices Off Fractionally

Broiler prices slipped fractionally during the week at the Lancaster Poultry Center, but still remained over 17 cents.

At the November 1 auction, a total of 79,550 head of broilers in 19 lots brought prices ranging from 16.7 to 18.1 for a sale average of 17.23. The sale average for the corresponding sale a year ago was 12.38.

The high lot, 1,600 White Vantress Crosses at 9 weeks 2 days, was consigned by Robert Noll and bought by Martin Brendle. Only one lot of broilers were not sold. These, a lot of 4,000 at 8 weeks, 3 days, were bid to 17.2. The only other lot not sold was 950 Leghorn Fowl which were bid to 8.7.

The sale also moved seven lots of 7,940 pullets at prices of 24.25 to 26; three lots of 3,150 leghorn fowl brought 7.4 to 8.8, and two lots of 1,200 heavy fowl brought 16.2 to 16.3.

Four lots of roasters crossed the block at 23-23.8 and 175 capons sold for 39 cents. A lot of 120 males were 8.8.

The complete sale offered 98,935 head in 38 lots and sold 93,985 head in 36 lots.

Delmarva Heavier Birds In Most Demand

Live prices advanced more than 1/4 cent with a good demand for the light offerings in Delmarva during the 24 hour period ending 10.30 Friday morning.

Heavier birds were on the high side of the price range with purchases at farms ranging from 16.5 to 17.8 on 746,100 head including 424,700 head purchased at Thursday's auction at Shelbyville, Del. About half the sales were at 16.5 to 16.9.

Ready to cook demand improved slightly to a fair position in some instances with demand spotty and mostly slow.

Estimated slaughter by Eastern Shore Processors for the week end was 685,000 head compared to the 623,000 head last week end.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending Oct 26 was steady with the previous week at 3.6. Broilers averaged 16.94 and mash cost the grower \$94.06 per ton.

Fluid Milk Supply Varied; Demand Good

Fluid milk production throughout the nation varied with the Northeast and West coast sections showing a generally slight decline while other areas noted receipts steady to slightly increased.

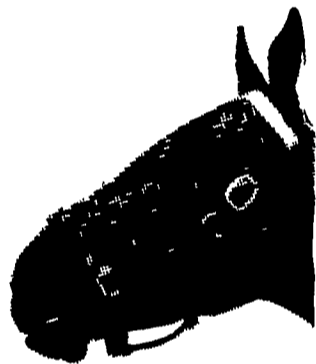
