Bureau of Foods and Chemistry, and two other separate agencies, The Penna. Milk Control Commission and the State Harness Racing Commission. An additional facility will be the adjacent greenhouses for plant pest control work and seed certification by the Bureau of Plant Industry. At the ceremonies this week, Governor Lawrence said, "It seems highly important to me that this Department and the Farm Show Building complex should be closely associated with each other, physically. It will make administration of Department affairs far easier and it will result in a far greater Pennsylvania Farm Show than ever before in history."

The \$2,968,000 structure is being built for the General State Authority by Ritter Brothers, Inc., Harrisburg.

Ground-clearing activity already has been completed. Trees, brush and several vacant farm buildings were bulldozed away last week. The adjacent eggplanting test facilities

were reorganized to permit razing of one building used as an office and egg room.

The four-story office section of the new building will front 211 feet on North Cameron Street. The laboratory area will extend back more than 300 feet to the east.

State Agriculture Secretary William L. Henning said he welcomed the new structure because it "will symbolize our modernizing agriculture and will give us up-to-date facilities for a wide range of consumer services."

Other speakers included John L. Lynam, executive director of GSA; Ivan McKeever of the federal Soil Conservation Service; Dean L. E. Jackson of the College of Agriculture, Pennsylvania State University, Donald V. Seipt, Keystone Farms, Easton; and the Rev. Donald R. Davis, pastor of Upper Spruce Creek Presbyterian Church in Centre County.

A representative of the contractor said Tuesday, he felt certain the date of August 1964 could be beaten by several months.
