Hereford steer calves for the Red Rose 4-H Baby Beef and Lamb Club will be up for grabs today at the New Holland Sales Stables.

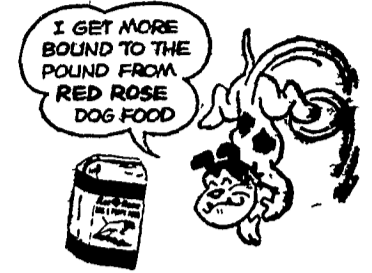
Beginning at about 9 a.m. members will draw for position in the final drawing for the calves. In order of the first number drawn, the members will then draw for the calf to become the project for the year.
