### Local Company Sponsors Meet On Feeding

What is being billed as "an exciting new discovery in dairy nutrition" will be discussed at a meeting of dairymen next Tuesday night at the Landisville fire hall.

Dr. William L. Ensor, manager of dairy feed research with the Quaker Oats Company will discuss research of a new feed concept called a Catalyzer which he did at the University of Maryland.

The process, basically, makes it possible for the first time, he says, to increase the calories of energy available to the dairy cow without increasing the amount of ration fed. The processes were perfected at the Full-O-Pep research facilities in Barrington, Ill. he said.

Closely controlled experi-

ments revealed cows fed the new concept feed produced about 20% more energy from the same amount of feed. Moreover, this extra energy is converted into extra milk — up to 10% or more over cows on regular feed, and this gain is sustained throughout the lactation period.

Wilbur Hiestand of the S H Hiestand Co., Salunga, says that this new concept in dairy feeding does not involve the use of drugs or hormones. The feed is palatable and you follow your regular feeding and management practices. The meeting, sponsored by S H Hiestand and Company will begin at 7:30 p.m.
