New Holland reported a barely steady price on top dairy cows at the November 7 auction Other kinds sold lower

The run includes 228 cows, six bulls and 12 heifers Fresh Holstein cows brought \$300 to 495, Guernseys sold for \$175-200 and other breeds made \$175-225.

Stock bulls brought \$110-185 and stock heifers sold for \$70-130.

At the November 5 sale of horses, the 245 head sold slow and at prices of \$10 to \$15 a head lower.

Pony mares brought \$65-90, while geldings sold for \$30-90 Riding horses brought \$100-225 per head, and driving horses were \$110-275. Killers were 6½ to 7 cents a pound

Hogs continued about steady at the November 5 auction There were 550 butcher hogs and 25 shoats in the run Retail hogs to local butchers brought 19-20 50, Wholesale hogs to the packers brought 18-19 while weights over 240 pounds brought 17-18 Shoats brought \$8 to \$16 per head

The 165 head of calves in the November 5 sale continued steady Choice calves brought 34-39 50, good and low choice were 28-34, standard made 24-28, and common 18 down


