This resulted in a further narrowing of the price spread on steers. Heifers steady to strong in a rather uneven trade Cows 25-75 lower Decline mainly on Canner and Cutter. Bulls lost early week advance and closed steady Few vealers steady. Not enough feeders sold for test of trends

The run consisted of 145 cows, four bulls and 13 heifers Fresh Holstein cows brought \$300 to \$450; Guernseys \$175-200, and other breeds \$175-225. Stock bulls changed hands at \$115-185, and stock heifers crossed the block at \$45-140.

Yearling Bull Tops Frey Sale At \$1,000 Price

The top animal, a yearling bull, brought an even \$1,000 at the dispersal sale of 78 head of registered Holsteins in the herd of J. Mowery Frey, Sr, Lancaster R7, on Tuesday.

The bull, sired by Osborn-dale Ivanhoe and out of Wrightwick Glenafton Rachel, was purchased by the New Jersey Cooperative breeding stud. The contending bidder was a Mr. Bunn from North Carolina, according to R. Austin Backus, manager of the sale.

Top cow, a five year old, brought \$830 The average price paid for the 78 head, including heifers, was \$418.
