**Start Survey Of Livestock**

Postmasters of the county announced today that rural mail carriers will begin distributing 1962 Livestock Survey cards to patrons on their routes about November 17. Livestock cards will be placed in the mail box of a sample of farmers served by the local post offices.

This Livestock survey is one of two which the Post Office and Agriculture Departments cooperatively conduct each year. The other one takes place in May.

The November Livestock Survey provides basic information to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service in Harrisburg, for estimating livestock numbers on farms, livestock production, the size of the pig crop this fall, the calf crop, the lamb crop; chickens raised, and milk cow numbers on farms. Reports from a cross-section sample of farmers provide the cornerstone for reliable and accurate forecasts.

To be sure our county is well represented in this State-wide survey Postmasters urge each patron receiving a livestock card to fill it out and return it to the carrier.

Rural carriers participating in this cooperative survey are Route 1, Charles Dussinger, Route 2, Stanley Zell, Route 3, Russell Erb and Route 4, Charles Showers.

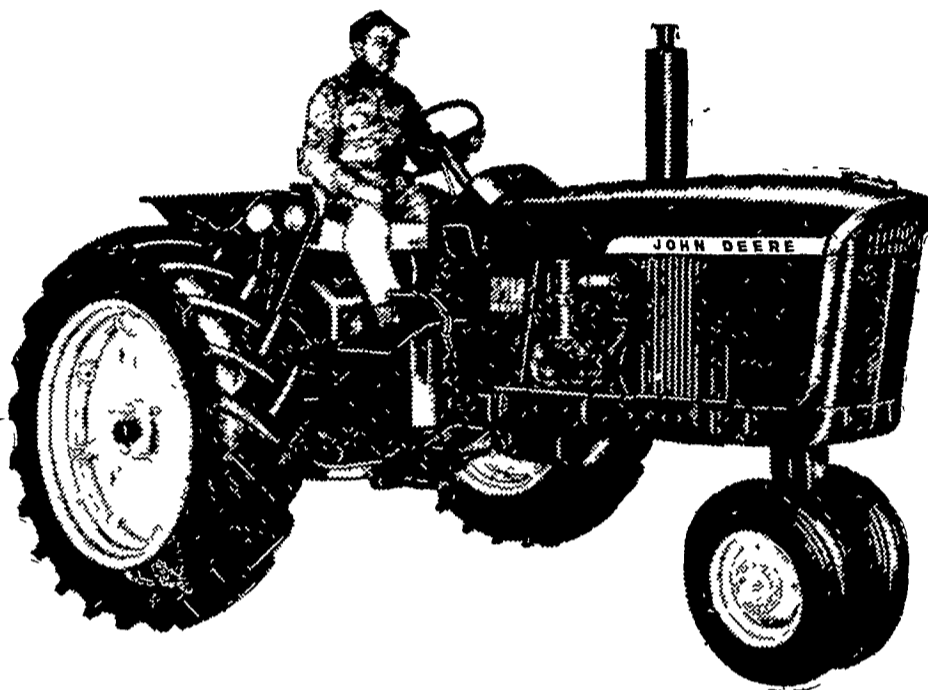
