 The firm purchased a total of 12 head from the show.
 David Denlinger, 2351 Horseshoe Road, showed the champion Shorthorn. It was bought by Stauffer's Suburban Diner at a bid of 33 cents a pound placed by Carl Dalton of Kunzler and Co.
 The Lancaster County National Bank, represented by Stanley Musselman, purchased the 1065 pound angus shown by Elvin Hess of Bareville. The steer will be donated to the club for the annual banquet in December. Purchase price of 34.50 per pound will be used by Hess toward his college expenses next year.
 The 119 steers in the five county show weighed a total of 116,475 pounds and brought a total price of \$39,579.78 to their youthful owners. The average price of 33.98

per pound, which was 20.00 per Cwt. over the average of last year. Average price with the champion was \$83.42 per Cwt.
