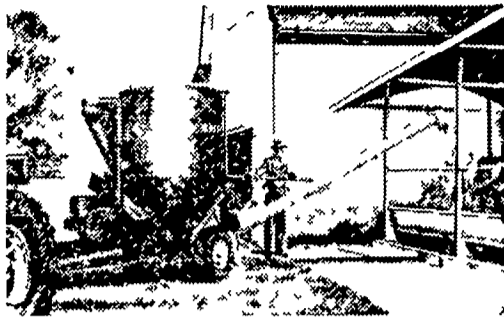

Prepared in several styles suitable for many uses, canned mushrooms may be sliced, whole or buttons, and stems or pieces. All styles are versatile and adaptable to a variety of preparations.

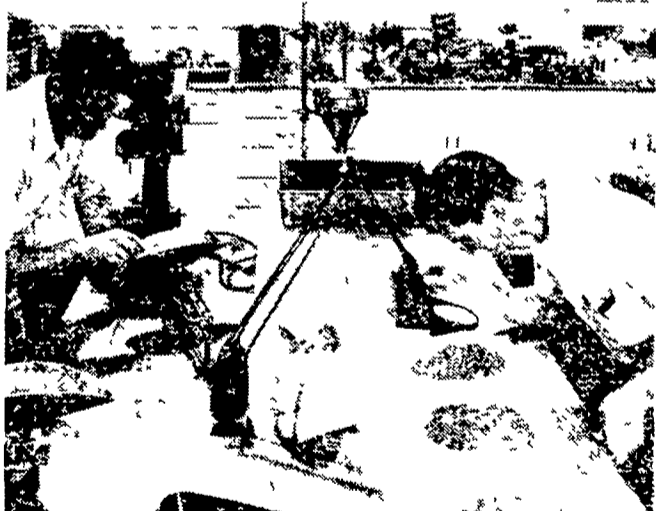

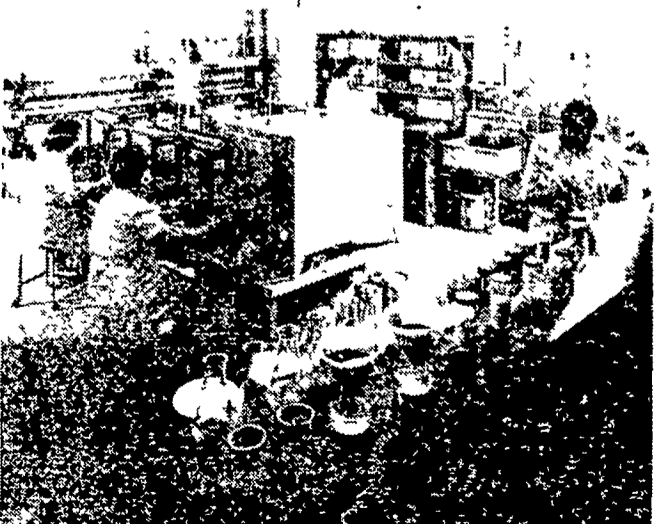
