

Prices Jump Two Cents

Broiler prices averaged 14 56 at the November 29 auction at the Lancaster Poultry Center. This is up two cents from the holiday-postponed sale of last week end. Prices ranged from 14 4 to 14 8 on 43,900 head at the November 29 auction as compared to the range of 12 7 to 12 8 on 82,200 head at the November 23 sale.

Two lots of broilers and one lot of geese were not sold. The 6665 head of broilers were bid to 14.1 and 14.6. The 100 geese were bid to 33.3. One lot of 600 leghorn fowl brought 9.0; a lot of 500 males brought 9.0, and five lots of 5,500 heavy fowl brought 17.8 to 18.3.

A lot of 2,300 pullets sold for 26.9 and three lots of roasters brought 26.1 to 27 for the 2,325 head.

The complete sale offered 61,890 head in 23 lots and sold 55,125 head in 20 lots.

Prices Gain A Full Cent

Delmarva reported a price advance of approximately one cent during the 24 hour period ending 10 30 Friday morning. A good demand took the heavy offerings as ready-to-cook demand increased to a fair position and many plants anticipating running at full capacity to fill orders.

Estimated slaughter for the week end by Eastern Shore processors was 790,000 head. No comparison with last week is available as the Thanksgiving holiday closed plants last Thursday.

Prices and reported purchased in Delmarva during the period ranged 13 1 to 14.7 for 1,018,500 head at farms. Prices included 613,800 head sold Thursday at the Eastern
