Pa. Farm Show Entry Deadlines Are Listed

HARRISBURG — Entries for departments still open for the 47th Pennsylvania State Farm Show continued to pour in today in advance of approaching deadlines. Livestock entries for the Jan. 7-11 show have already closed.

John B. McCool, director of the big all-Pennsylvania exposition, said exhibitors in categories yet to be filled should fare much better than last-minute entries in dairy and livestock, many of which had to be declined for lack of space.

McCool said he was confronted with the problem of turning back 119 head of dairy cattle, 40 sheep, 69 hogs, and 28 horses.

Generally it was a case of first come, first served with the latest arrivals feeling the pinch of space. Postmarks on entries were checked to determine priority.

State Secretary of Agriculture W. L. Henning, chairman of the Farm Show Commission, said: "It's the same story all over again. It happens every year. Space is too limited to take care of all the farmers who would like to exhibit their dairy animals and livestock."

Next deadline, McCool announced, will be Dec. 8 for 4-H Club classes in sheep. Entries close Dec. 15 for the always-popular horse and mule pulling contest, and for broiler and roasting chickens. Last date for entering the 4-H Club sheep blocking and grooming contest was set for Dec. 29, and for 4-H Club potato grading contest, Jan. 2.

Other closing dates: Jan. 4 — individual exhibits of apical products in commercial 4-H and vocational classes. Jan. 5 — corn, small grain, potatoes, grass silage, hay, cigar leaf tobacco, sugar maple products, wool, baby chicks, and poults, and all classes in home economics. Jan. 6 — apples, edible nuts, Christmas trees, eggs, dressed turkeys, including 4-H Club classes. Jan. 7 — vegetables, including vocational class.

The show, open only to Pennsylvania exhibitors, is conducted by the State Farm Products Show Commission, an agency of the Pa. Department of Agriculture. Heading the commission is Gov. David L. Lawrence. Dr. William L. Henning, State Secretary of Agriculture, is chairman.

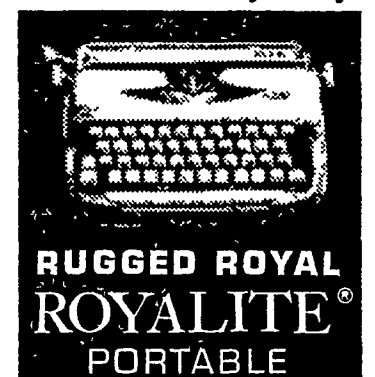
