

Guernsey Cow Has Top Record In D.H.I.A.

A registered Guernsey cow in the herd of Robert A. Bieneman Strasburg R1, completed the highest 305 day lactation record in the Red Rose Dairy Herd Improvement Association in October

The registered Holstein herd of Paul B. Zimmerman, Ephrata R1, had the highest butterfat average per cow during the testing month

The Breneman cow, a five year old finished her lactation with 791 pounds of butterfat in 16410 pounds of milk with a 48 per cent test

Two other cows in the as-

sociation finished lactations with more than 750 pounds of butterfat. A grade Holstein in the herd of Adam B. Esbenschade made 756 pounds of fat in 19,249 pounds of milk and a registered Holstein in the herd of Amos B. Lapp produced 750 pounds of butterfat in 21,448 pounds of milk

Ten other cows in the association had better than 700

pounds of butterfat during the lactations ended in the month. They were in the herds of J. Eby Hershey, John R. Sauder, Clarence L. Keener, Ben M. Stoltzfus, Ivan G. Martin, Amos B. Lantz, Paul B. Zimmerman, John E. Kreider, Mary B. Stoltzfus and Robert W. Ulrich.

In the butterfat averages, the 26 registered Holstein cows in the Zimmerman herd had 1,722 pounds of milk with a 36 test for an average of 62 pounds of butterfat each

The herd of 22 registered Holsteins owned by Dan S. Stoltzfus, Mount Joy R1 was second high with 1,517 pounds of milk, a 40 per cent test, and 61 pounds of butterfat each

Christ K. Lapp and Son, and Elam B. Beiler had herd averages of 57 pounds of fat, and the herd of John O. Stoltzfus averaged 56 pounds. An average of 55 pounds per cow was produced by the herds of C. Robert Greider, and Jacob N. Good.

Twelve other herds averaged 50 or more pounds of butterfat during the month.

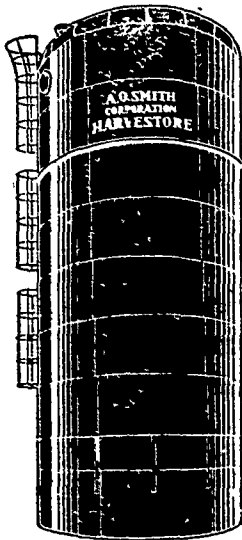
