week, the student selects an article of particular interest, reviews it for the class and makes a written report which will become a permanent part of his school notes

Is Lancaster Farming new to the students? On the contrary. Six of the seven boys in the class have subscriptions going to their homes

Is there any advantage, then, to having the paper also sent to the classroom?

In the words of one boy, "I used to read only the articles that I thought would be interesting, and sometimes I didn't have time to read the rest. Now I read everything, and find many more interesting things than before."

Another student said, "I usually read only the things about livestock because that is what I am mostly interested in, but I made a report on the egg story (egg washing in processing plants) and I found that was informative too."

But Herr says he believes one of the most important advantages to the program is the increased knowledge of market reports the boys are gaining. He says the class is

able to discuss market news and trends intelligently since beginning the graphs.

Herr also believes the use of a farm newspaper stimulates more interest in farm management classes than information in text books and other resource materials

"I can say I am more than pleased with the results," Herr said. "I think it is one of the best teaching tools I have ever used."

were located in eleven counties — Allegheny, Berks, Bucks, Clinton, Columbia, Lancaster, Lehigh, Dauphin, Somerset, Potter and York.

Only three of the 53 fields exceeded virus tolerances for certified seed. One of these was planted with Pennsylvania seed, the other two with out of state seed. Yount attributed the low virus averages for the entire checked acreage to improved aphid-vector control from use of some of the newer insecticides.
