Total patron purchases during the year amounted to \$4,021,442 compared to \$3,900,249 the previous year.

Total savings to patrons was down by some \$1,599 55, due mainly, according to Wolgemuth, to increased dividends on preferred stock and an increase in Income Tax which took an additional \$2,299 43 this year compared to the 1961 report since the Old Quarryville mill was sold at a loss in 1961, Wolgemuth said

Members passed a resolution to amend the by-laws of the cooperative to conform to the by-laws consent provision required by the Revenue act of 1962. The amendment eliminates the need for the cooperative to get consent from members to withhold a percentage of patronage refunds over 20 per cent and issue them as revolving fund certificates The members must report all patronage refunds as personal income

Members also voted to increase payment to directors from \$7 50 per day to \$15 per day at the discession of board members

Four directors elected at the meeting were Henry E. Shenk, Manheim R2, Northwest district, J Everett Kreider, Quarryville R1, Southwest district, Allen K Risse, Leola R1, Northeast district, and Elvin Hess, Sr, Strasburg R1, Southeast district

The president's report was made by Willis Esbenschade, and the report of the General Manager was given by Charles C Durkins Main speaker of the afternoon was George Steele, president of the Chester-Delaware Farm Bureau Cooperative Association.
