Apple fanciers at the Pennsylvania Farm Show will have an opportunity for checking their knowledge of varieties and in making identifications at an exhibit of eighty different kinds being assembled by Dr. Carl S. Bittner, chairman of horticulture extension, the Pennsylvania State University. All of the varieties were grown in 192 in the university's orchards Bittner said the display will include some of the old favorites and will feature also the more popular newer varieties The display will be part of the main horticultural display in the east end of the large lobby at the front of the main exposition hall.

Most of the 78 horses at the December 31 auction went to the killer market at prices of 7 to 7 1/2 cents a pound.

Ten different Pennsylvania state departments or commissions and the U.S. Social Security Administration today were preparing special exhibits for the 47th State Farm Show, Jan. 7-11 in Harrisburg. The list includes the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture whose Farm Show Commission conducts the exposition. The others: Departments of Highways, Public Instruction, Health, Forests and Waters, and Commerce, Turnpike Commission, Civil Service Commission, Game Commission, and Historical and Museum Commission.
