Twenty-one Lancaster County school girls are slated to receive the coveted State Homemaker degree for outstanding club work in Future Homemakers of America, at the association's annual convention in Harrisburg next Wednesday.

The convention will be held in conjunction with the annual Pennsylvania State Farm Show.

The State Homemaker awards are the highest that can be earned by FHA members. The statewide organization now has 13,000 members in more than 400 chapters in local high schools. More than 1,800 members and advisors will attend the annual awards meeting in the Forum of the Education Building on Capitol Hill.

To qualify for the advanced degree in FHA, member candidates, in addition to being outstanding homemaking students, must have a two-year record of active membership in a local chartered FHA chapter and shown achievements in a program of activities at local, regional, state and national levels.

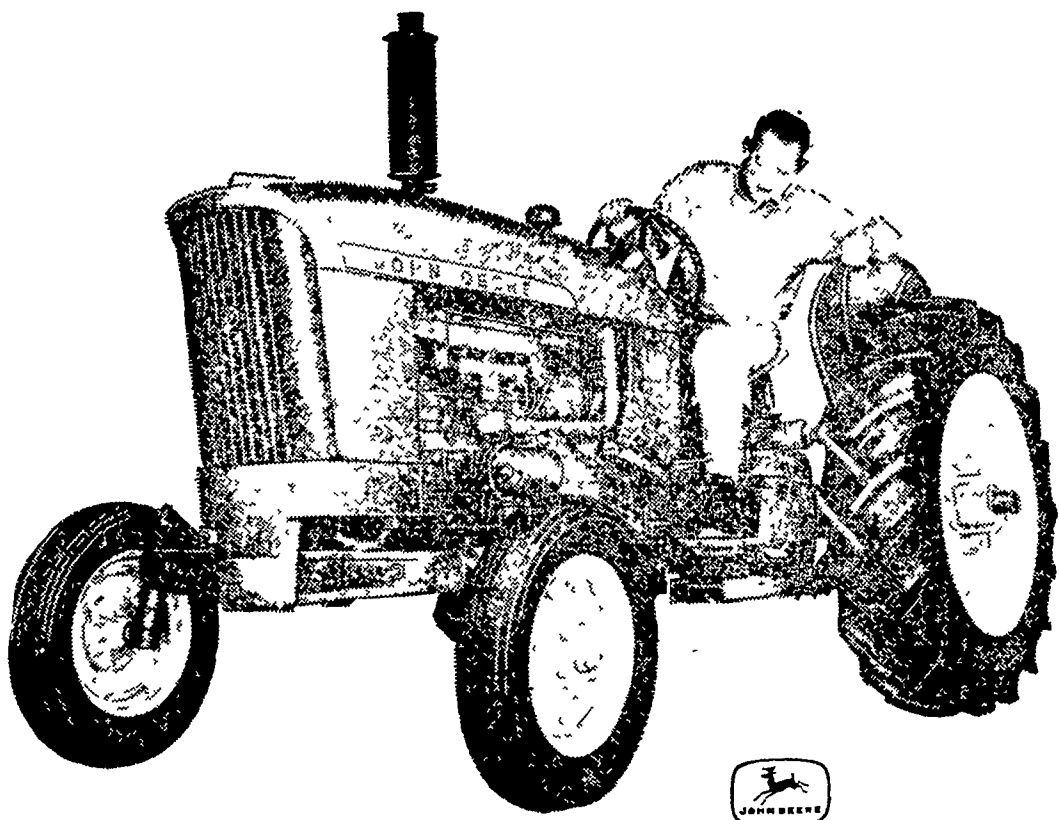
