New Equipment Is Installed By Egg Co-op

Installation of the latest word in egg processing equipment began this week at the Producers Cooperative Exchange, Coatesville.

Features of the automatic egg handling system include automatic sizing. Each egg is weighed within a fraction of a

second to a tolerance of 1/50th of an ounce.

Other features are automatic blood spot detector, which picks out and packs blood spots in white and brown shell eggs, and in-plant washing and drying. This last feature can save many hours of the poultrymen's time by relieving him of the task of washing his eggs at the farm level, and assuring Mrs. Housewife of a clean, good quality egg.

Equipment is expected to be in full operation by February first. The Cooperative leases the equipment from Food Machinery Corporation.

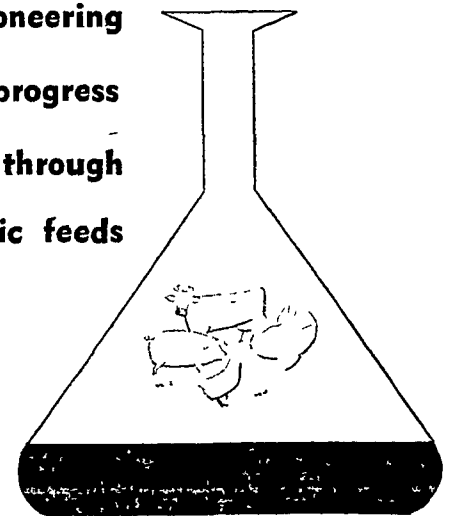
