

Prices Up Fractionally

Broiler prices gained fractionally and volume dropped slightly compared to last week at the January 10 auction at the Lancaster Poultry Center.

A total of 57,550 broilers in 15 lots changed hands at prices ranging from 15 5 to 16.2. All broilers on offer were sold. One lot of 2200 White Vantress broilers was withdrawn prior to the sale.

Three lots of heavier birds failed to sell at the offered bids of 16, 18 and 20.

Three lots of leghorn fowl sold at prices of 9 to 9 3.

The complete sale offered 64,750 head in 21 lots and sold 61,450 head in 18 lots.

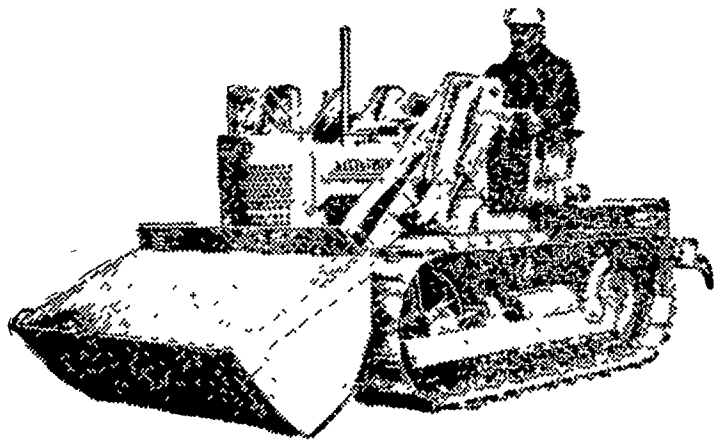
