 able to buy alfalfa this spring, but if he waits until he is ready to sow, he may be wasting his time discussing varieties. DuPutis is in the worst situation. Our current price list going out with our catalog will not list it, but we have

good replacements Cody alfalfa is replacing Buffalo, and the farmers might as well not be able to buy Buffalo much longer. Haymor is a good replacement for DuPutis. Cayuga will be available, and Cornell Experiment Station recommends it very highly. Pennscott red clover is in

very short supply. The clover seed producing areas of Oregon and Washington are now growing alfalfa seed because it makes them more money. Except for Pennscott and Chesapeake, there will be plenty of red clover around, but it may cost a little more. There will be grass seed for

everybody. I don't see any lower prices for any of these seeds. I see nothing for a farmer to gain price wise by waiting to order. Sudan and sorghum crosses are increasing in demand, but

I wouldn't say last year's dry weather has everybody flocking in to buy them. There will be some planting of emergency crops. Corn seed supplies are adequate. We have a better supply of the newer and better varie-
