

John Esh Herd Has DHIA High Average

The 23 registered Holstein cows in the herd of John E. Esh, Gordonville R1, had the highest monthly butterfat average in the Red Rose Dairy

Herd Improvement Association during the December testing month

The herd averaged 69 pounds of butterfat in 1,824 pounds of milk with a 3.8 per cent test

Second high in the butterfat averages were the 24 registered Holstein cows in the herd of Jacob K. Stoltzfus, Honey Brook R1. This herd averaged

68 pounds of butterfat in 1,717 pounds of milk with a 4.0 per cent test

The high lactation completed during the month was 25,610 pounds of milk with a 3.5 test for 890 pounds of fat made by a registered Holstein in the herd of Richard Landis, 2306 Horseshoe Road, Lancaster

Second high lactation was made by a registered Holstein owned by Earl L. Groff, Strasburg R1. She made 818 pounds of butterfat in 20,206 pounds of milk with a 4.0 test. Both lactations were on a 305 day basis

No other cow in the association made over 800 pounds of fat in her lactation ending during the month. Registered holsteins in three other herds made over 750 pounds of butterfat. Henry Kettering had a cow which made 759 pounds of fat in 16,445 pounds of milk. A cow in the herd of Ezra Martin made 752 pounds of fat in 17,746 pounds of milk, and Leon W. Hess has a cow with 752 pounds of fat in 15,793. Sixteen other cows had lactations over 700 pounds of fat

The herds of Elam B. Beiler, Dan S. Stoltzfus and Earl E. Martin had averages 66 pounds of fat during the month. Ten other herds in the association had 60 pounds of fat or better
