Trading on slaughter steers and heifers very uneven. Weak to 50 lower. Cows weak to fully 25 lower. Bulls mostly 100 lower. Small supply feeders weak.

Farm mortgages made or recorded in the first half of 1962 were up 15 percent over the same period in 1961, reports Fred Hughes, extension farm management specialist with The Pennsylvania State University. The overall volume of lending was the largest for any six-month period since the beginning of 1934.

At the January 11 sale of horses, ponies and mules, 203 head sold. The trend was steady.

Mules by the pair brought \$300-475. Mare ponies sold for \$50-80 and gelded ponies were \$25-80. Riding horses crossed the block at \$110-265, and driving horses were \$110-290. Killers were 7 to 7 1/2 cents a pound.

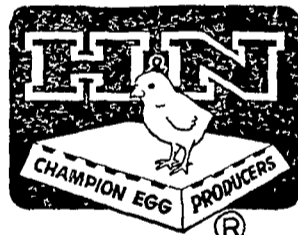
