Today use of safe chemicals to increase corn yields and lower production cost, is fast becoming the standard growing practice At the clinic farm chemical specialists will discuss the basic principles of chemical weed control, how to get the most out of each herbicide dollar, how long chemicals are effective in the soil, how to apply weed killers for best results and many other topics

If growers are faced with the corn rootworm problem, the specialists will discuss soil insects, the damage they do, and how to control them

Note date of the meeting and plan to come A question and answer period following the program is expected to stimulate a lively discussion. In answering questions, the specialists will draw on experiences from all major corn growing areas of the United States as well as on local results, Daughterty said

which is just about the same as the previous year While the cooperative serviced more cows, less semen was sold out of the area The net margin for the year was \$25 749 which will go to the members as patronage refunds at the rate of 16 cents per each \$5 00 first service

A total of 70 6 per cent of the business was in the Holstein breed while beef breeds accounted for 14 6 per cent of the total Guenseys made up 10 3 per cent of the first services, and the other three dairy breeds accounted for 4 5 per cent of the business

During the year 911 shares of inactive stock was redeemed and 833 new members were added to the rolls This brings the total to 9 707 members for the year
