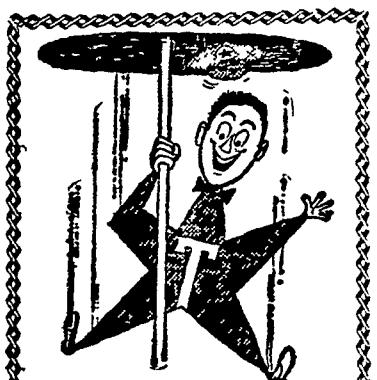

Recognition certificates and pins will be presented to 4-H leaders for years of service during the annual banquet of the Lancaster County 4-H

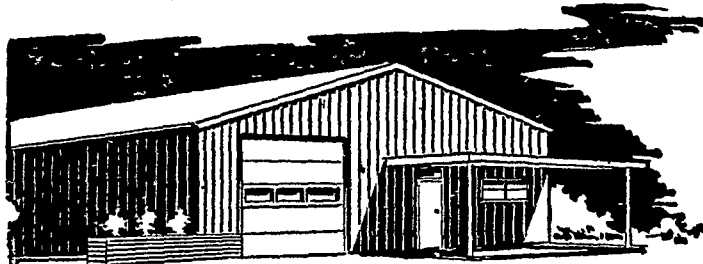
Leaders' Council on March 4 at 6 p.m. in Hostetter's banquet hall, Mount Joy.
