4-H Home Ec. Clubs Teach **Domestic Skills**

By: Mrs. Herbert M. Royer Each year the President of the United States proclaims a National 4-H Club Week. March 2-9 has been designated as such with the theme - 4-H. Young Citizens in Action. About two million town and country youth (10-20 years of age) will share in this observance from coast to coast

Some aims of National 4-H Club Week to be carried out in Lancaster County will be: 1, Emphasize career exploration and the value of wise decisionmaking regarding vocational choices, 2, to influence more youth to join or form 4-H clubs, 3, to acquaint more parents with 4-H and seek their cooperation, 4, to encourage more leadership among youthminded adults to serve as volunteer local leaders and to honor 4-H friends locally and nationally, expressing appreciation to them for their contribution to 4-H work

From the home economics department, many local women, serving in the capacity as local leaders, are busily engaged attending leader workshops and business training meetings conducted by the Home Economics Extension personnel.

This year Lancaster County is oftering several new projects tor 4-H girls, such as - Start With A Small Change - designed for girls 10 to 14 years of age - to learn redecorating their own room or adding chaim to another room in the home For the older girls in the 15 to 19 age group, there is the project - Food, When Company Comes - which includes consumers buying tips, budgeting, meat cookery etc.

As in previous years Child Care, Foods and Nutrition, Party Time and Clothing Construction will be available to local girls For example in the clothing project, the piocedure to follow and the goals to strive for can be Starting at the age of 10, a girl enrolled in 4-H work, can make a simple gathered cotton skirt as a first year member, m second year she can make a sleeveless, collailess, cotton dress or jumper, third year her project can be, a cotton school dress with set-in sleeves and collar (shirtwaist) fourth year, it can be a blend tablic in a diess-up garment and fifth year and upward she can be on free-lance projects When a 4-H girl has three years of clothing constiu-Revue In turn, 11 she succeeds in being one of the top ten finalists, she automatically, becomes elegible for the District Diess Revue held at Stiawbridge and Clothiei in Philadelphia in August From there the first place winner goes on to the ships are awarded to the premium winners
