must divert 10 per cent of his small farm base, and he may voluntarily divert an additional 20 per cent or enough to make 15 acres. In other words, a farmer with a 13 acre small farm base could divert the entire amount and be eligible for payment at the rate of 50 per cent of the county support rate times the farm's normal yield. The mandatory 10 per cent diversion payment would be at the rate of 30 per cent of the county support price times the normal yield of the farm.

Pinay used this example: If a small wheat grower has been growing 8 acres of wheat under the present 15-acre exemption, his 1964 allotment would be 7.2 acres (8 acres less 10 per cent). If his average yield has been 40 bushels, his normal production will be set at 288 bushels.
