Repair Damaged Trees

Heavy winds with heavy ice formations on tree branches can cause damage. Trees having soft, brittle wood, such as soft maple, willows, and poplars suffer extensive damage. Craig S. Oliver, extension horticulturist at Penn State, suggests that broken branches be cut off and damaged areas be treated. Wounds and cuts should be covered with "wound paint" to reduce further damage by decay. For more detailed information, see your county agent.
