

# Only Broilers Are Offered Price Steady, Demand Fair

An extremely small sale at 5000 WV, 9-2, Daniel K. Good, the Lancaster Poultry Center 16.5; 5. Same (Raymond offered only broilers but all birds on offer were sold. Prices were down almost a half cent from the previous week.

Only 11 lots including 52,000 head of broilers changed hands at prices ranging from 16.5 to 17.2 for a sale average of 16.53.

At the corresponding sale last year only 16,800 broilers sold at an average of 16.27.

The top lot of broilers at the April 18 auction was 1,000 White Vantress pullets at nine weeks and two days, consigned by D. E. Horn and Company, grown by Raymond Emig and purchased by Carl B. Risser. One lot of 1,500 Indian River broilers were withdrawn prior to the sale.

### Price Steady, Demand Fair

Live broiler prices in Delmarva remained comparatively steady during the 21 hour period ending 10.30 Friday morning. A fair demand met the heavy offerings.

Prices and reported prices at farms during the period ranged from 15.6 to 16.4 for 1,043,000 head including 576,800 head sold at Thursday's auction at Selbyville, Del. On the sale, 35 per cent of the sales were at 16 to 16.4.

Estimated slaughter by Eastern Shore processors for the week end was 802,100 head compared to the 589,000 head last week end.

Georgia reported average live prices declining under heavy slaughter. Ready to cook demand was greatly improved and generally considered good

Estimated slaughter in Georgia for the week end was 2 million head compared to the 1,779,000 head last week end.

Prices at farms during the 24 hour period ending 10:30 Friday morning was 14 cents with some birds on prior commitments going as much as three quarters of a cent higher.

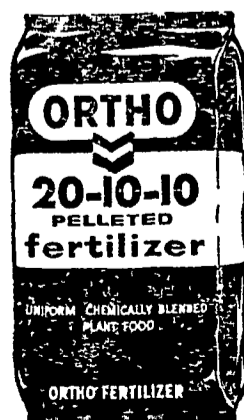
