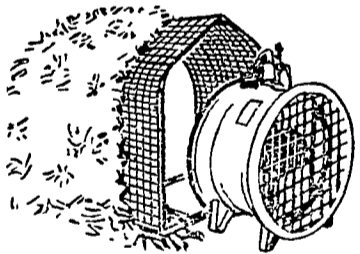

Dairymen like lush pastures for their dairy cows, but Joe Taylor, Penn State extension dairy specialist, sounds a warning. The change from winter feeding can cause mastitis. He advises feeding some hay and grain before cows go out to pasture each day early in the season.
