The upturn in slaughter steer and heifer prices that began late last week carried through to mid-week and compared last Friday closing sales slaughter steers 25-50 higher Heifers steady to 25 higher This first time in six weeks the trend has been heifer Cows closed steady to 25 lower Bulls and feeders mostly steady Prices for Chicago carlot dressed beef higher early part of the week but declines late left closing prices, steer beef steady to 25 lower. Heifer beef 25-50 lower and cow beef 25 to mostly 50 lower.

Dairy cattle met a steady market at the May 22 auction at New Holland There were 106 cows, six stock bulls and 11 stock heifers on offer.

Fresh Holstein cows, brought \$275-400; Guerneys \$150-225, and other breeds \$150-225 Bulls brought \$140-235 and heifers sold for \$65-

At the May 20 sale of horses, ponies and mules, 274 head crossed the block at steady prices. Mules were \$95-130. Pony mares brought \$60-125 and geldings were \$40-140. Riding horses changed hands at \$130-300 and driving horses were \$120-225. Killer horses brought 7 to 7½ cents a pound.

At the May 20 hog sale 379 market hogs and 48 shoats were sold The market on hogs was 50 higher.

Retail hogs to local butchers brought 17 to 18 with grades 1 to 3 going to packers at 16.50 to 17. Heavy, fat hogs brought 15 50-16 50, and sows sold for 11 50 to 13. Shoats brought 8 50-14.

The 85 calves sold steady at the May 20 auction. Choice and prime vealers brought 34-38, good and choice 30-34, standard 26-30, and common 22-26.

During 1962 more than 60% of the total of Series E Savings Bonds sold were in smaller denomination bonds — \$25 through \$200 The volume of \$50 E Bonds sold set a record high for peacetime.

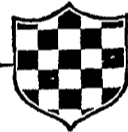
