apraying operations next year. dustries Association.

As has been the practice for time because of its greater maneuverability. The balance of the area was sprayed by the U.S. Department of Agriculture with a biplane. Both operations in the joint project were done on contract by experienced commercial operators at a total cost of approximately \$10,

Professionally trained and experienced entomologists from the State and U.S. Departments of Agriculture supervised the apray application. In the 31 years since the gypsy moth was first found in Pennsylvania, near Inkerman, Luzerne county more than 1.5 million acres of the state's woodlands have been treated against the moth's ravages.

Effectiveness of the control program has been shown, Nixon stated, by virtual complete local eradication of the gypsy moths. With only one exception, moths never have been found in sprayed areas.

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
