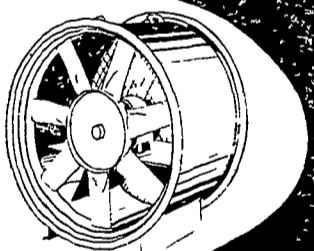

CATTLE — Salable receipts first four days 28,200, compared 19,800 for holiday shortened supply last week and 33,200 a year ago

Compared last Friday, slaughter steers steady to 25 lower. Heifers steady to 50 lower, decline mainly on good and below Cows weak to 25 lower. Bulls and few feeders steady. In Chicago carlot dressed beef trade, steer beef 25-50 lower. Heifer beef steady to mostly 25 lower. Cows beef steady to 50 higher.

Hog prices were 50 higher at the June 3 auction at New Holland. There were 468 head in the run. Retail hogs to local butchers brought 19-19 85. Number 1-3 to the packers

were 18.50-19, and heavy-weight butcher hogs were 17.50-18 25. Sows sold for 12 50-14 50 and shoats were 10-12 50.

Prime vealers at the June 3 sale were 1 00 lower, but all other kinds were steady. There were 124 head on sale. Choice and prime brought 32-35; good and low choice 28-32, standard 25-28, and common 22-25.

Dairy cows at the June 5 auction sold steady as 98 cows, eight bulls and 17 heifers changed hands.

Fresh Holstein cows brought \$275-450; Guernseys \$150-225, and other breeds \$150-325. Stock bulls brought \$110-230, and heifers \$65-200.

The 235 head of horses were active and fully steady with killers selling higher at the June 3 auction.

Riding horses were \$130-240; driving horses \$130-210, and pony mares \$60-120. Pony geldings sold for \$40-135. Killers brought 8 to 9 cents a pound

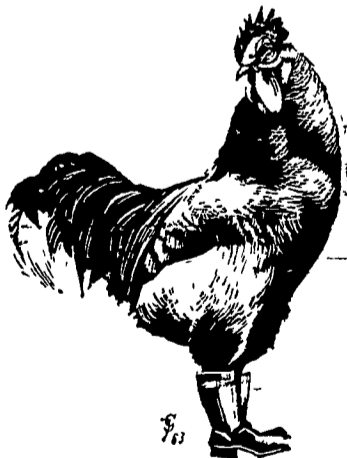

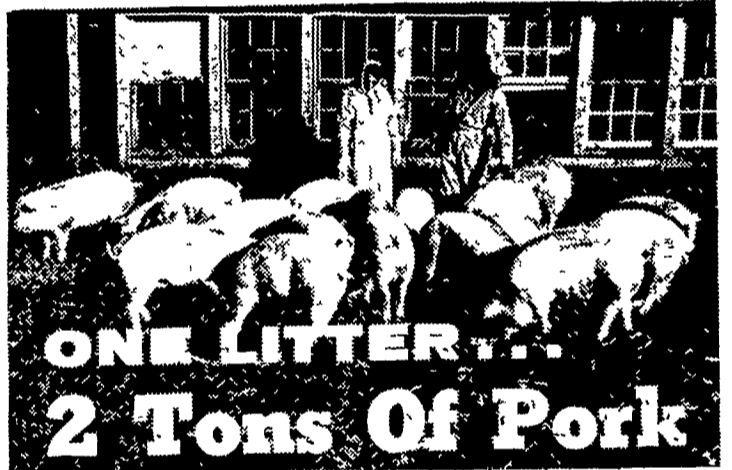
