Dairy cattle sold on a steady market at the June 19 sale. There were 123 cows, one bull and nine heifers.

Fresh Holstein cows brought \$275-375; Guernseys \$150-275, and other breeds \$150-250. 250 Stock heifers were \$150-250.

At the June 17 sale of horses, 225 head crossed the block. Of special note was a three year old registered Appaloosa Stud which brought \$740. Other riding horses sold from \$135 to \$275. Driving horses brought \$135-225. Pony mares were \$65-125 and geldings brought \$35-125. Killer horses continued at 7½ to 8 cents a pound.

The June 17 hog sale had receipts of 306 head. Prices were steady to 25 higher.

Retail slaughter hogs to local butchers brought 19 to 20 with a few head to 21. Grades 1 to 3 sold to packers for 18.50-19. Heavyweight hogs brought 17 to 18.25.

Vealers continued steady at the June 17 auction with prime grade absent from the 90 head run. Choice vealers brought 32-35, standard 24-28, good and low choice 28-32, and common 20-24.

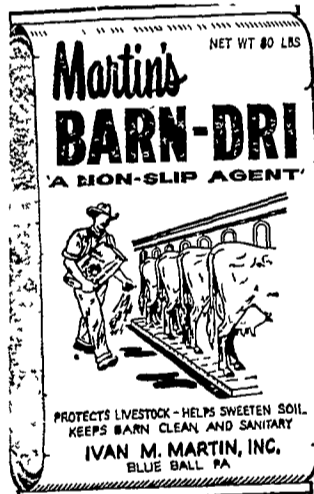

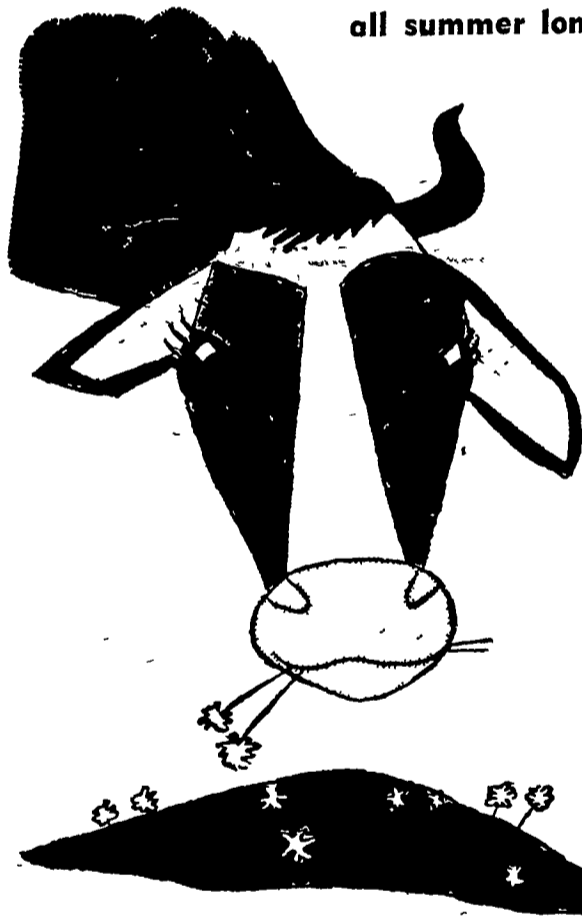
