But not all of Robert's work with dairy cows is done in the barn. He judged dairy cattle at the state FFA contest for two years placing 122nd among future farmers as a sophomore and 31st as a jun-

ior He was a member of the 1962 state 4-H dairy judging team that placed fourth in the national contest at Waterloo, Iowa.

He was assistant secretary of his local FFA chapter in 1962 and president this year. Honors this year included winning the coveted Keystone Farmer degree, the National FFA Foundation medal for public

speaking and Star Farmer of his chapter. He was captain of the state champion parliamentary procedure team at Penn State, in June.

During his last high school year he was vice-president of the local chapter of the National Honor Society, a commencement speaker, and announcer for both the band and chorus concerts at the school. In 1960 he was winner of the Rural Youth award at the Solanco fair.

In 4-H work he is president of the Southern Lancaster County Holstein club, a member of county council and a past secretary and treasurer of the southern 4-H tractor club.

His teacher of vocational agriculture, William M. Fredd, said of Robert, "I have never worked with a finer boy, or one easier to work with. He has not only made me a better teacher, he has made many a boy a better boy because he was not interested in himself; he was interested in the group." Fredd paid tribute to the family also, calling his parents extremely cooperative and helpful.
