New Holland Sales Stables reported a 50 to 1.00 higher market on the 1123 head of cattle.

High choice and prime steers at 900 to 1,300 pounds brought 24-25.85. Good and low choice were 23-24.50 and commercial steers were 21 to 22.

Cows sold steady with commercial cows at 16-17, cutter and canner 14-16, and low cutter 12-14.

Fresh Holstein cows brought \$275-500; Guerneys \$150-210; and other breeds \$150-440. Stock heifers brought \$65-165.

At the July 1 horse sale all kinds sold steady except killers which were 50 lower.

Riding horses brought \$125-300, driving horses \$125-200, pony mares \$65-140, and pony geldings \$35-140. Killers were 7 to 7½ cents.

The market on the 459 hogs at the July 1 auction was fully 75 higher. Retail hogs to local butchers brought 19-20.50. Grades 1 to 3 to the packers brought 19-19.75. Heavyweight and lightweight hogs brought 18-19. The 64 shoats brought 8.50 to 12.

Calf receipts were 105 head. The market was 1.00 lower with choice and prime vealers bringing 32-34.50, good and low choice 26-30, standard 20-24.

Seventy to 90 pound hogs brought 19-22.50.
