Broiler Prices Are Down

Live broiler prices dropped more than a cent a pound from the previous week at the July 11 auction at the Lancaster Poultry Center. A total of 94,000 birds in 16 lots sold at prices ranging from 16.3 to 17.2 for a sale average of 16.48. The previous week's sale, postponed to Friday by the fourth of July holiday, ranged 17.4 to 17.7 on 72,050 head in 17 lots.

At Thursday's sale a lot of 1,150 leghorn fowl brought 10 cents a pound. Two lots of 5,540 heavy fowl brought 14 and 14.4, while two lots containing 1,650 roasters sold for 19 cents.

The complete sale offered 103,995 head in 22 lots and sold 102,705 head in 21 lots.

Delmarva Prices Gain Half Cent

Live broiler prices in Delmarva advanced approximately ½ cent during the 24 hour period ending 10.30 Friday morning.

Demand was good for the heavy auction offerings. Ready to cook demand was improved to a mostly fair position and reported as good in instances. Sizes continued to be lighter than desired.

At farm prices and reported purchases during the period ranged from 15.6 to 16.6 for 941,000 head including 573,700 head purchased at Thursday's auction at the Eastern Shore Poultry Growers Exchange.

Estimated slaughter by eastern shore processors for the week end was 868,000 head compared to the 923,000 head last week end.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ended July 5 was up one point from the previous week at 3.2. Broilers during the week averaged 16 10 per pound and 20 per cent mash cost the grower \$99.34 per ton. During the previous week broilers averaged 15.50 and mash cost \$100.49 per ton.


