

Live Broilers In Decline

Live broiler prices were down more than a half cent at the July 25 auction at the Lancaster Poultry Center. All broilers on offer were sold.

A total of 62,500 broilers in 10 lots brought prices of 15.4 to 16.3 for a sale average of 15.54.

Three lots of roasters including 1,655 birds brought 18.5 to 19.0. Five lots of pullets changed hands at 19.1 for the 4,600 head.

A total of 11,300 leghorn fowl in four lots sold for 10.2 to 10.5, while 2,075 heavy fowl in five lots changed hands at 15.4 to 15.5.

The complete sale offered 83,452 birds in 28 lots and sold 82,302 birds in 27 lots.

Only one lot on offer failed to sell; this, a lot of 1,150 White Vantress cockerels at 14 weeks, was bid to 19 cents.

Delmarva Broilers Down A Quarter Cent

Live broiler prices in Delmarva continued to decline more than a quarter cent. The demand was slow and inactive for the moderate auction offerings.

Delmarva reported prices of 14.4 to 15.6 for 950,600 head at farms during the 24 hour period ending 10.30 Friday morning, including 479,600 head sold at Thursday's auction in Selbyville, Del.

Estimated slaughter by eastern shore processors for the week end was 821,000 head compared to the 734,000 head last week end.

The Delmarva broiler-feed ratio for the week ending July 19 was steady at 3.2. Broilers averaged 15.95 per pound and mash cost the grower \$100.17 per ton.

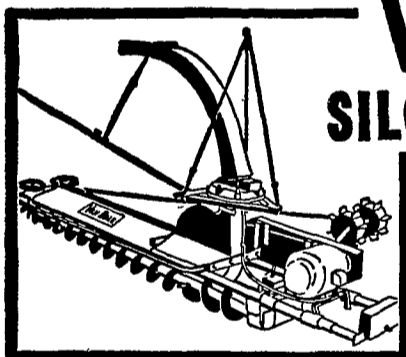

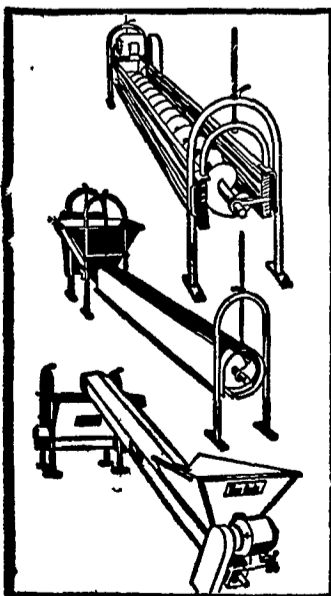

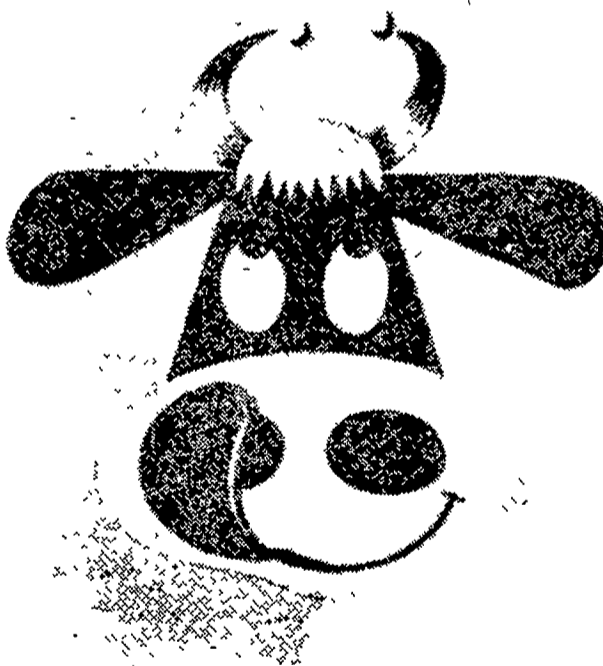
