 Slaughter steers uneven, weights 1250 lbs. and down fully steady, over 1250 lbs 25-75 lower with some Choice and Prime over 1400 lbs. fully 1 00 lower, heifers fully steady. Cows 50-75 higher with Canner and Cutter up most Bulls 50 to mostly 1.00 higher. Few feeders steady.

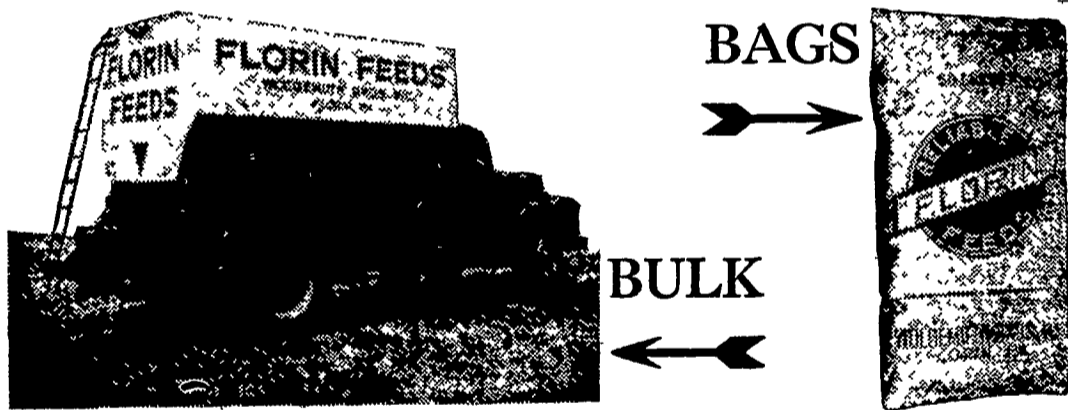

 Slaughter steers: High Choice and Prime 1000-1250 lbs. 26.50-27.00, few 27.10, Choice 950-1250 lbs. 25.00-26 50, Choice 1200-1400 lbs. 24.50-26 50, Good to low Choice 23.00-25.00, Standard 21 50-23.00.  
 Heifers: Some Standard and low Good 650-810 lbs. 21.00-22.25.  
 Cows: Cutter and Utility 16.00-17.50, Canner and low Cutter 14.00-16.00, Shelly canner down to 12.00.  
 Bulls: Utility and Commercial 19.50-22.00, Good grade 22.00-23 85, Feeder Steers Medium and Good 650-950 lbs. 20.50-23.25.

 Dairy cattle sold at steady prices on the July 31 auction.

The run included 188 cows, one bull and 40 heifers.  
 Fresh Holstein cows brought \$275-425; Guerneys \$150-225, and other breeds \$150-300. Stock heifers brought \$65-170.  
 Horses sold slow but barely steady at the July 29 auction as 202 head crossed the block. Riding horses sold for \$100-225, and driving horses brought \$110-315. Pony mares were \$60-110, and pony geldings changed hands at \$40-125. Killers continued at 7 to 7 1/2 cents a pound.  
 The 458 market hogs sold steady at the July 29 auction. Retail hogs to local butchers brought 20.5 to 21.60, while grades 1 to 3 to the packers brought 19 75-20.60. Heavy-weight hogs brought 18 to 19.50. Sows were 12 to 15. The 38 shoats sold for \$8 to \$12 per head.  
 The July 29 calf auction met a steady market as 120 head were sold. Choice and prime vealers brought 28-34, good and low choice 25-28, standard 22-25, and cull and common 16-22.
