Dairy cattle sold at active to strong prices on the August 7 auction. The run included 191 cows, 6 bulls and 31 heifers.

Fresh Holstein cows brought \$275-450; Guernseys \$175-250, and other breeds \$175-275. Stock bulls were \$140-210, and stock heifers \$65-175.

Horses sold slow and steady at the August 5 auction as 221 head crossed the block. Riding horses sold for \$100-240, and driving horses brought \$100-260. Pony mares were \$50-115, and pony geldings changed hands at \$30-125. Killers continued at 7 to 7 1/2 cents a pound.

The 421 market hogs brought prices \$1.00 lower at the August 5 auction. Retail hogs to local butchers 20 00 to 21 25, while grades 1 to 3 to the packers brought 18.75 to 19.50. Heavy-weight hogs brought 18 to 18.75. Sows were 12 to 15. The 75

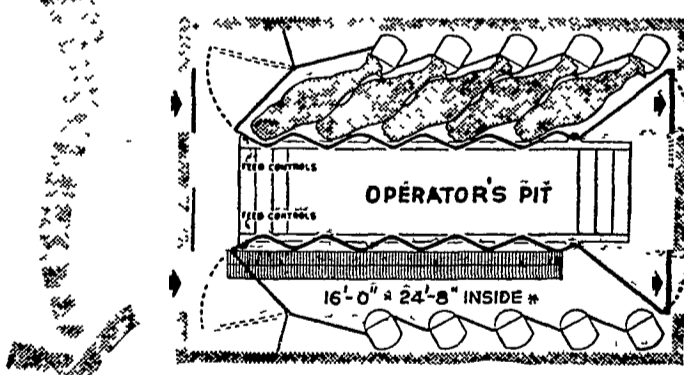
