### Fed. Land Bank Lowers Rates

Warren R Fankhanel, President of the Federal Land Bank of Baltimore, announced today that effective September 16, 1963, the interest rate charged by the Bank on new leans will be reduced from 6 to 51/2% and that on the same date, the Bank will voluntarily reduce to 51/2% the interest charged to borrowers whose loans now carry a 6% rate

Fankhanel stated "These actions are in line with the longtime policy of The Land Bank to provide mortgage credit to farmers at the lowest possible cost consistent with sound business operations". Fankhanel also pointed out that the voluntary reduction in rates on loans outstanding is virtually unprecedented outside the Land Bank system

Pennsylvania Game Law enac ted by the recent session of the state legislature and signed into law by the Governor on August 7, the fee for the 1963 resident hunting license will be \$520, an increase of \$2 05 over last year. The only exception is that resident youngsters between the ages of 12 and 16 years, inclusive, will pay a \$3.20 fee. Game Commission spokesmen emphasized that youngsters making application for the \$3 20 license must write their date of birth on the application blank in addition to giving other required information They said that even though every application must show the hunter's age in a blank provided for this puipose, the 12-16 year old applicants must also write in their

date of birth.
