

## Open Forum On Project 70 Is Scheduled

Dr. Maurice K. Goddard, Pennsylvania Secretary of Forests and Waters, will be the main speaker at a public forum on Project 70 next Wednesday, Sept. 18, at 8 p.m. in the Armstrong Auditorium.

Robert K. Mowrer, chairman of the Parks and Open Space Advisory Committee of the Lancaster County Planning Commission, said all public officials and citizens of the county are invited to attend the meeting.

Mowrer said, Project 70 is a far reaching proposal to provide funds for acquiring rapidly disappearing open land throughout the state for regional and community parks, water reservoir sites, historical markers, and hunting and fishing areas. Funds would be made available to counties, cities, boroughs, and townships as well as the state to acquire the land needed for recreation and conservation projects.

Dr. Goddard is nationally recognized as one of America's foremost conservationists and a leader in the development of parks, recreation areas and water resources.

The County Planning Commission and its Advisory Committee has endorsed PROJECT 70 in principle feeling that it is one method for acquiring recreation and conservation areas necessary for our rapidly increasing population.

The Commission's staff is now in the process of completing a county-wide inventory of existing parks, recreational facilities and open space areas.

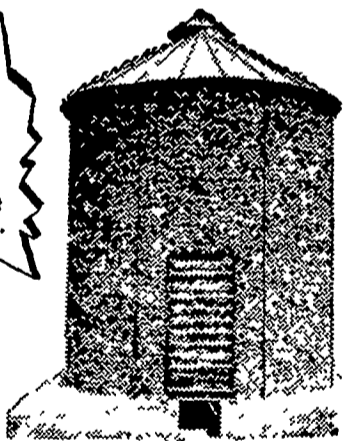
