Second Year 4-H Member Wins Lampeter Beef Show

Eleven-year-old Myron Landis, Strasburg R1, showed a blocky, 900 pound Angus to the grand championship in the West Lampeter Community Fair beef Show Wednesday night.

Joey, the Angus, bred by Kinloch Farms, Supply, Virginia, was the second steer fed by Myron for 4-H competition. Two other children of Mr and Mrs. Myron Landis, Sr., figured in the placings at the show. Mary Lou showed the champion Hereford and Frieda's steer

placed third in the Hereford competition.

At the 1959 edition of the same show, Nancy, an older sister of Myron, paved the way by showing an angus to the top spot.

Reserve honors at Wednesday night's exhibition went to the shorthorn, Corky II, shown by Donna Hess, the 11 year-old daughter of Mr and Mrs. Elvin Hess, Jr, Strasburg R1. The steer was from the herd of Harold Endslow, Marietta (Continued on Page 16)

Fultonway Rachel Ann, a five-year-old Holstein cow exhibited by J. Mowery Frey, Jr, 401 Beaver Valley Pike, won the breed championship Thursday afternoon at the West Lampeter Community Fair.

Rachel Ann, the daughter of Frey's excellent Rachel cow, is now milking over 22,000 pounds of milk and nearly 800 pounds of fat. She was grand champion at the Southeastern Pennsylvania Artificial Breeders Cooperative show as a two-year-old and a four-year-old.

The junior champion and reserve grand champion was the senior yearling exhibited by Robert Kauffman, Elizabethtown R1.

Roy Breneman, Willow Street R1, had the top Guernsey, a senior yearling, exhibited Thursday by Arthur Breneman. The reserve champion Guernsey was Melvin Breneman's aged cow.

R1, repeated her showing at the Solanco Fair a week earlier when her four-year-old Jersey won that breed's top honor. Reserve spot was taken by a two-year-old shown by Marian's brother Marvin.
