Horses were slow and lower as 199 head sold at the Sept 23 auction. Riding horses brought \$100-200, driving horses \$100-210, and pony mares \$40-85 Gelding ponies were \$30-90 Killers brought 6 to 6½ cents a pound.

The 414 hogs at the Sept 23 sale sold on a steady market. Retail hogs to local butchers were 18 to 19, while grades 1 to 3 went to packers at 17-17 50. Heavyweight hogs were 15 75-16 75, and sows brought 13-15.

Calves sold steady at the Sept. 23 sale. A total of 414 head crossed the block. Choice and prime vealers were 33-38, good and low choice 29-33, standard 25-29, and common 15-25.

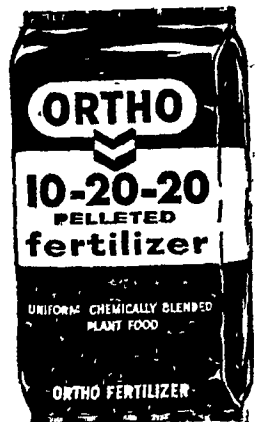
