Spittler, Sheridan R1, Parliamentarian of his local chapter and was elected to receive the Red Rose Farmer degree at Monday night's meeting.

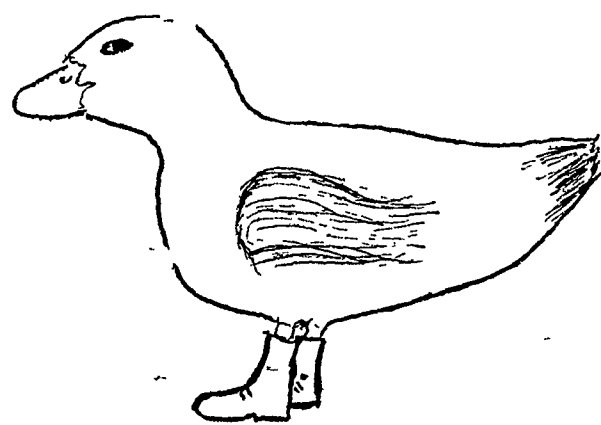
