Test Lawn Soil

If you are planning a new lawn, Jack Harper, Penn State extension agronomist, suggests getting a soil testing kit from your county agricultural agent. Instructions for taking the soil sample and for mailing it to the laboratory come with the kit.

Solve Rust Problem

Modern science has an answer to the iron rust in water supply problem. Henry Wooding, Penn State extension agricultural engineer, says that plastic pipe is a good replacement for badly corroded or rusty metal pipe, and it can be installed rather easily.

Prevent Poultry Losses

Carl O. Dossin, Penn State poultry extension specialist, urges poultry producers to take a cautious lookout, especially in secluded areas, for any caving material. Protection against predators when making and constructing poultry buildings is important.

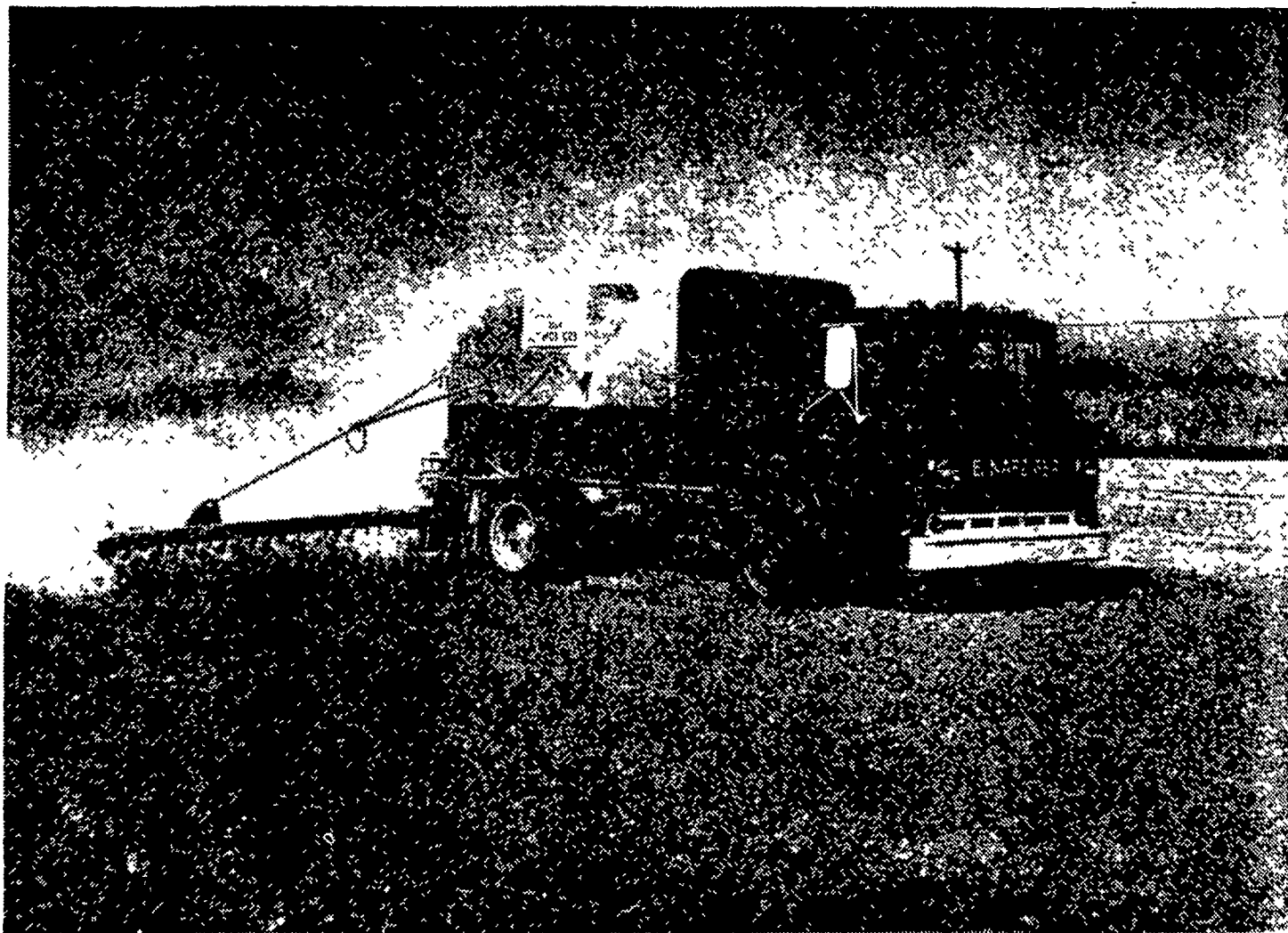
