Of the cows in sale 7 with records over 10,000# of milk, most of the rest over 9,000#. Eight fresh or due in August, September, or October. With few exceptions, in our opinion, this herd would classify Very Good down the line. Records were not made as a "once in a lifetime" effort for each cow. They all produced at this high figure year after year, they and their offsprings can do it for you.

The Hansel cattle are young and out of some of the best cows he has ever owned. Bernard Snider, New Enterprise and Bob Smith, Bedford, who bought some of Steve's cattle can tell you what they have done for them.
